

The United Nations Security Council

Topic: The Situation in Ukraine

Co-sponsors: Commonwealth of Australia, People's Republic of China, Rpublic of Azerbaijan, Republic of Chile, Republic of France, Republic of Korea, Russian Federation, United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland

The Security Council, recognizing that the United Nations Charter Chapter V, article 24, section 1 gives the Security Council the "primary responsibility for the maintenance of international peace and security",

<u>Reaffirming</u> the Millennium Development Goals One, eradicating extreme hunger and poverty, Four, exterminating child mortality, and Eight, global partnership for development,

<u>Noting</u> with deep concern the amount of displacement and death in the eastern Ukraine, <u>Confirming</u> the fact that NATO has stated that if Ukraine becomes part of NATO, NATO will threaten Russia with missiles, or vice versa,

- 1. Expresses its hope that the Minsk protocol discussed by the leaders of Russia and Ukraine will hold;
- 2. Strongly encourages a new round of voting to be held by the people of the Crimean peninsula to determine officially whether Crimea will become part of Ukraine, Russia, or its own country;
- 3. Requests that member states provide peacekeepers in the buffer zones to minimize the amount of civilian causalities,
- 4. Requests of Ukraine to not join NATO or the EU because of the threat to Russia with missiles;

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- 5. Strongly encourages Crimea to continue letting Russia keep their naval fleet in the Black Sea until the lease expires (2042);
- 6. Calls upon the leaders of Ukraine and Russia to have another peace summit in June, 2015;
- 7. Encourages all member states to be unbiased regarding this conflict because of the danger of any one nation allying with a certain side in the Ukrainian Civil War.
