**Topic:** "Child Labor"

The General Assembly, reminding member states of their commitment to the Convention on the Rights of the Child and the Optional Protocols, with specific regard to child labor, calls upon each country to strengthen efforts and adherence to laws working to eliminate child labor and to elevate the importance of protecting the human rights of every child, under all circumstances, remains,

Deeply concerned that around 215 million children across the world work full time jobs with no access to basic necessities such as education,

Keeping in mind the reasons for continued child labor include lack of education, cultural values, easy profit for businesses, and poverty within families,

Recognizing and viewing with appreciation the efforts taken by world organizations like the ILO to alleviate child labor,

1. Strongly condemns child labor in any form and exploitation of children and recognizes the need of protecting the human rights of every child;
  - a. Making the restriction age by the governments of countries, for the labor market, as minimum 16 years,
  - b. Protection of children and adolescents below the age of 19, from working in hazardous conditions like matchbox making, firecracker industries, chemical
