
**Topic: Cyber Security**

The General Assembly,

Recognizing the importance of international relations, deeply concerned by the growing rate of cybercrimes, desiring international security, taking into account the unprotected devices that are prone to being hacked, fully aware of important files being stolen by cyber criminals, realizing that the population of hackers is growing, contemplating the possible solutions to this world wide problems,

1. Suggests that we should educate younger people to know the dangers of a cybercrime;
2. Accepts friendly hackers testing cyber security of other countries;
3. Considers that the government facilitates cyber activity;
4. Realizes the need to raise money to improve security in underdeveloped countries;
5. Calls upon IDR to conduct a study on the currents use of ICT's by governments and encourages cooperation between states;
6. Promotes education packages sent to people when they make social media accounts;
7. Allows the International Criminal Police Organization (INTERPOL) to go out to arrest cyber criminals overseas;

8. Seeks out NGOs that could have raise money to acquire virus protection programs for developing countries;
9. Supports MLAT's (Mutual Legal Assistance Treaty);
10. Recommends creating international cybercrime prevention task force;
11. Encourages technologies, including firewalls, key coding, passwords usernames, anti-virus and hack proof software to keep all information secured; and
12. Draws attention to laws to take legal actions against cyber criminals.
