



# BUREAU MEMBER TIPS ON POSITION PAPERS

## RESEARCH, BIBLIOGRAPHY AND TOPICS

*“Read lots of sources, ask questions about what you don’t know, and find passion in the issues you’re writing about. Don’t stress it- just keep up the good work!”*

*“Take time to think through and reflect!”*

*“It is never a bad idea to contact the local representation of your country to ask them about their position, it is an excellent primary source!”*

*“Always keep track of your sources, you can never have too many!”*

*“Good research makes a good position paper. Dedicate more time investigating rather than focusing too much on how you write your position paper.”*

*“Use reliable sources and research what the UN has done in the past that addresses your topic. Understanding what has already been done will help guide you to create solutions that build on previous work!”*

*“Read, read, read, ask questions, discuss, understand to the best of your ability, ask for help.”*

*“If you have a good understanding of your country’s position, before you start your position paper, it will be easier to write.”*

*“Gather as much valuable information as you can at first, then narrow it down to what you need.”*

*"Stick to the views of your country, even if it goes against your personal beliefs."*

*"Don't overthink them – I know position papers can seem a daunting task at first, but if you break them into different parts they are much easier than they seem!"*

*"Do a lot of research of your Country's background in order to better understand the problems they are facing and what solutions might really be helpful in their situation."*
