Topic: Refugee children

General Assembly, United Nations formed an agency today known as United Nations High Commissioner for Refugee (UNHCR) in 1950. UNHCR was established in 1993.

Taking note that by improving the Refugee Council it will help refugee children, Deeply disturbed because taking children away from family will create more trauma,

Fully aware that by creating non-governmental organizations (NGO) will help overcome the barrier of refugee children,

1. Encourages safer homes/houses/shelters;
2. Further recommends sending care packages full of healthy foods, first aid kits, and books to the refugee children;
3. Supports creating camps in safer countries with safe shelters;
4. Further invites having therapy, learning, medical assistance and care packages for shelters and camps;
5. Notes education for refugee children with subjects such as their culture will help refugee children that have been pulled out of school, they must learn about children's rights;
6. Considers donating old clothes and shoes for those who have none;

7. Draws the attention of a non-governmental organizations and governmental organizations such as the British Red Cross, The Refugee Council and International Refugee;
8. Recommends providing water filters and rain water catchers;
9. Approves security within the camps;
10. Authorizes all children under the age of 18 may be put in foster care and be adopted;
11. Request countries that do not accept refugees to help donate;
12. Accepts children to practice their own religion;
13. Endorses refugees in between the ages of 14-18 to learn how to get a job and also pay bills.
