

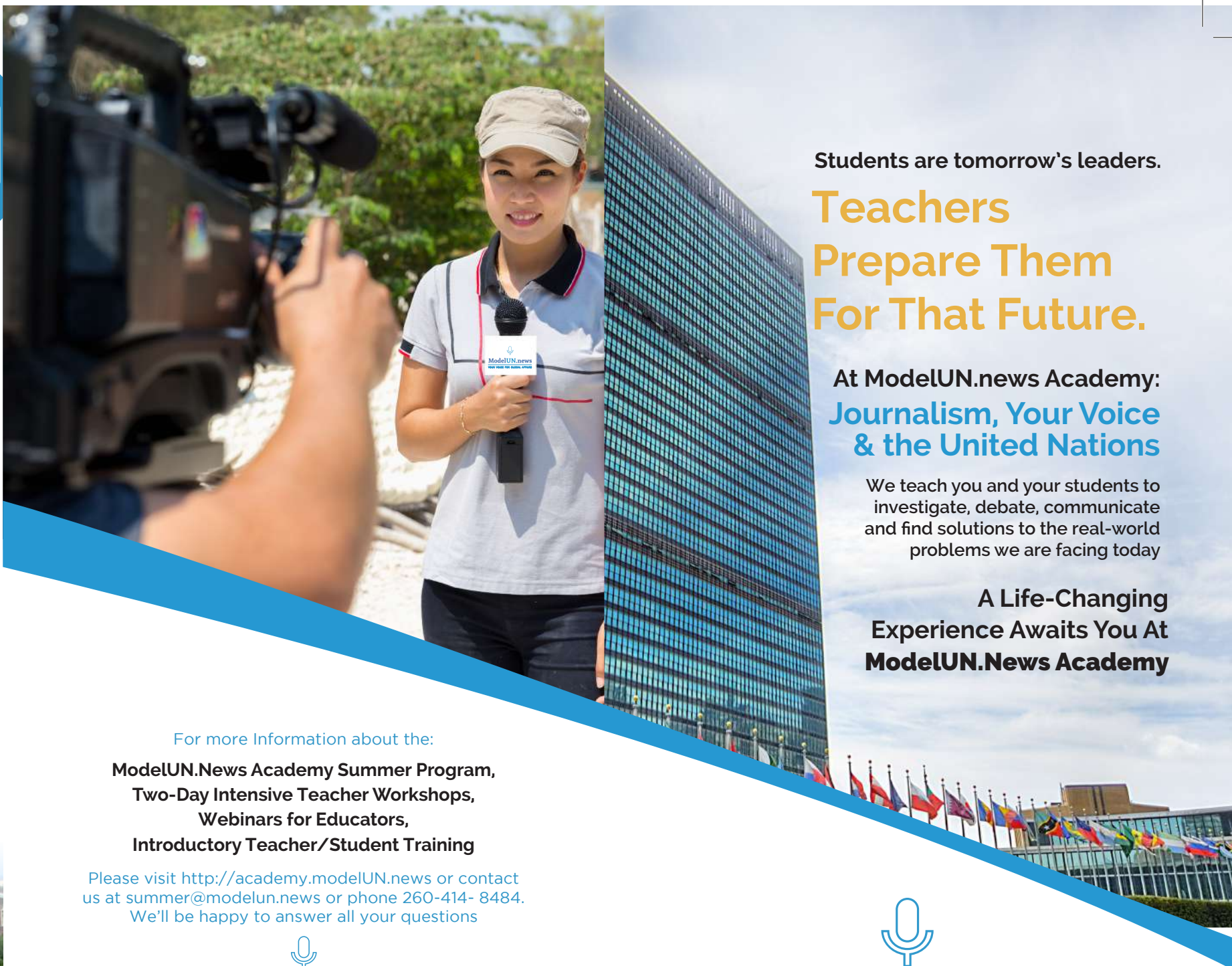

MODELUN.NEWS SUMMER PROGRAM

What the program does for students:

The week-long ModelUN.News Academy Summer Program is held at New York City's Columbia University and allows students, ages 10 to 18, to learn communication skills from international journalists, to meet with ambassadors, diplomats and NGO executives and to work collaboratively with young people from all over the globe on real-world problems culled from the Sustainable Development Goals of the United Nations.

The ModelUN. News Academy Summer Program helps students hone their critical thinking, teaches them to research and investigate a topic, and draw and present conclusions. They also learn to improve their writing, as well as how to create and broadcast videos, podcasts and news programs spotlighting important and timely subjects. Students also gain valuable experience that stands out on a college application.

What the program does for you as an educator:

The ModelUN.News Academy Summer Program will give you vital information about the UN and world issues, train you and your students to communicate more effectively, and educate you in classic journalism and new media techniques. The program will help you steer your students to a wider worldview and prepare them to take their place as leaders in the world.

Teacher Training Sessions:

The MUNN Summer Program also gives you the opportunity to attend complimentary Teacher Training Sessions held during the week of the program—which may be used for professional development credit on such topics as:
