1. Draws the attention of governments to strengthen and enforce laws to help children by working with NGOs, UNICEF and the UN;

2. Expresses its hope for more successful disarmament, demobilization, and reintegration organizations;

3. Condemns armies that recruit children into armed groups;

4. Endorses creation of safe houses for rehabilitation and reintegration;

5. Further invites search parties to find children that have been abducted and recruited;

6. Further requests for security in public places such as schools, neighborhoods, and highly populated shopping areas; and

7. Calls upon effective officials to go to different countries to help support D.D.R. and draws the attention to people everywhere to spread awareness and help end the problem of children in armed conflict.
