Topic: Nuclear Disarmament

The General Assembly, reminding all nations of the threat of nuclear weapons, keeping in mind that many nations feel safer with nuclear weapons,

Having considered the threat of nuclear arms,

Aware that total disarmament is probably not attainable in the near future,

Fully believing in the power of nations to develop new nuclear power plants capable of deweaponing Fission materials,

Striving to obtain passive relationships between nuclear and non-nuclear powers, Desiring to create a world where no country is threatened by nuclear weapons,

- 1. Advises talks between nuclear powers in reducing the need for these weapons if they agree to disarm;
- 2. Proposes a treaty that prevents countries from using nuclear arms unless they are attacked by nuclear weapons and need defense;
- 3. Encourages countries to dismantle their nuclear arms; and
- 4. Urges countries to consider the effects of nuclear fallout.
