Deeply concerned with the rising of Military Budgets;

Alarmed by the fact that countries are directing their focus to military strength:

Aware of the rapidly expanding expense of military expenditures;

Declaring that countries should find a compromise with their military needs;

- Calls upon countries to reduce their military spending by 1.5% every year, for 5 years, to redirect the money saved to reduce poverty, increase educational budgets, and other areas to benefit the people of their nation;

- 3. Invites countries to host an international summit to discuss and negotiate with the more powerful countries spending amounts on military budgets to help reduce overall national budgets:
- Strongly encourages countries to set a limits for military spending, with the cap being decided by the UN treaty and the specific country;
- Emphasizes improved transparency of each government's military budget spending;
