## **Resolution 1.1**

**Topic:** Rights of the Child

SOCHUM, reaffirming the Convention on the Rights of the Child, which states that a child is anyone under the age of 18. Because they are not as experienced as adults, they are more vulnerable, and need protection. Therefore, children are denied their human rights.

Bearing in mind that is an international problem,

Noting with regret that problems with children's rights are in most countries,

Noting with satisfaction that on December 20th, 1959, the declaration of the rights of children was signed into international law.

- 1. Designates marathons to send money to children in poverty;
- 2. Encourages countries to campaign on the way people think about children's rights;
- 3. Urges countries to take actions and work together to form an international anti-trafficking law;
- 4. Trusts governments to supervise the status and complaints of children;
- 5. Solemnly affirms that primary education should be mandatory and free;
- 6. Declares that governments need to donate money towards children in poverty;

7. Considers strict laws with hostile punishment for violating children's rights.
