Topic: Reduction of Military Budgets

The General Assembly, noting the need for the destruction of weapons of mass destruction,

Fully alarming those not reducing their military budgets,

- 1. Recommends under the protection of emergency disaster relief and social order that every member state of the United Nations, that there be a decrease in individual national defense budgets;
- 2. Calls upon all countries to stop the development and use of nuclear weapons;
- 3. Urges all countries to publicize their military expenditures in order to promote the global reduction of military budget;
- 4. Encourages nations to spend money on education, health, food, shelter, and less on military;
- 5. Promotes NATO's requirements of 2% reduction in military spending;
 - a) Further supports an even greater reduction than 2%:
- 6. Sets a limit of how much money is allowed to be spent each year on the military;
- 7. Encourage countries to regularly report so that the UN knows how much money nations are spending on their military and the UN will suggest changes;
- 8. Encourages countries to agree on percentage of GDP to spend on military, which they should comply for three years;
- 9. Every country should make alliances and make people feel safe through reduction of arms;
 - a) This can be done by selling arms in order to receive aid;
- 10. Creates a competition for reduction of military budgets in various nations;
