Topic: General and Complete Disarmament - The Illicit Trade in Small Arms and Light Weapons in all its Aspects

The General Assembly, having considered that by selling guns to metal factories to have them melted will provide money to build Montessori Schools,

Approving the marking of weapons so that police can know where they come from,

Promoting stronger security around banks so that they are a safe option to store small arms,

Ensuring border patrols could be implemented if a gunman manages to get a small arm and take it to a different country, the country that was stolen could report the gunman to the country the gunman stole it from,

Convinced that if countries use police force during attacks, after an attack the enforcement could search the area for small arms and turn them to the government,

6. Recommends a stricter arms regulation;
 1. Encourages the international community should provide assistance to the underdeveloped areas and maintain stability in order to reduce demand for small arms and light weapons;
 7. Draws attention that people do have jobs, so instead of making guns, these jobs can be to melt guns for materials so they don't lose their jobs;
 2. Approves only giving bullets to armies and not to the people directly;
 - a) This way, when they finish using the bullets, they cannot use an old gun;
 8. Encourages all countries to use the Industrial Tracing Instrument (ITI);
 3. Reduces the scope of gun protection and bans on the private production of weapons;
 9. Recommends all countries to bury all weapons that are not in use;
 - a) Otherwise it will return to its supplement legal liability authority;
 10. Encourages all countries to join the arms trade treaty.
4. Suggests lightening security in countries in order to lessen the threats of terrorists, and the people will have liability authority;
5. Governments have the primary responsibility to intensify their efforts to understand the problems of the illicit trade of small arms and light weapons in all its aspects and to add practical
