Topic: Young People in the Development of Human Settlements

The UN Habitat, *recalling* the 8 Millennium Development Goals, fully aware of the need of education in slums and developing countries, appreciating all past efforts to help this problem,

1. *Reaffirms* the involvement of kids in our programs;
2. *Encourages* the use of asset mapping to plan future schools;
3. *Confirms* the improvement of current schools to support all children;
4. *Requests* the training of new teachers;
5. Resolves a system of motivation for kids;
6. *Endorses* the programs for parents and their involvement in their children's school lives;
7. *Recognizes* the need for building of new schools;
8. *Stresses* the need for children and parents to be motivated;
9. *Approves* the building of new schools to better educate and motivate the children;
10. *Considers* adult education;
11. *Urges* the involvement of youth in the development of schools (ex. painting, etc.);
12. *Calls* for the improvement of schools before the building of new ones to save money;
13. *Requests* that all schools include classes for life skills (ex. cooking, cleaning, self sufficiency, etc.);
14. *Urges* youth from more privileged schools to donate some of their time to helping less fortunate communities and schools.

Topic: “Elimination of slums worldwide, especially in Asia”.

Noting with approval the 25th article of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, deeply concerned by the ever growing population of people living in slums, believing that more action should be taken towards eradicating slums,

1. *Calls upon* all countries to raise international awareness of slums, and their people;
2. *Request* annual conferences to be used to support developing cities, where UN Habitat members could meet;
3. *Recommends* the use of urban planning to develop new housing;
4. *Supports* jobs in and outside of cities by creating new farms, clean energy, and regulating migration or on the server for;
5. *Firmly recommends* the regulation of migration to cities and other countries;
6. *Emphasizes* the need for the creation of health care centers;
7. *Has resolved* to improve current housing and create PVC houses for those with little or no current housing;
8. *Proclaims* the need for sanitation systems in slums and other areas with poor sanitation;
9. *Expresses* its hope for the creation or addition of community centers with reasonably priced food and water in areas of need.
