Remembering those killed and wounded in acts of terrorism and counter-terrorism,

Declaring that terrorism must be eradicated,

Reaffirming that terrorism is not limited to one race or religion,

Realizing that violence is rarely a solution,

Convinced that education is necessary for the prevention of future terrorism,

Believing that the involvement of the International Criminal Court in all countries is a

crucial step to ending terrorism,

- 1. Recognizes the importance of strong and reliable democratic governments;
- Emphasizes the importance of education that promotes access to information, current events, and significant issues;
- 3. Solemnly affirms that violence is sometimes necessary in appropriate scenarios;
- 4. Calls upon all countries to cooperate and work together to create a safer world ;
- Endorses the use of peacekeepers in places with high terror rates to protect civilians;
