Special Political and Decolonization Committee

Fully aware that peacekeeping operations are a necessity but need improvement,
Noting with concern that there are very few women peacekeepers compared to men,
Recognizing the abuse of power by peacekeeping officials against women and children,
Alarmed by the sexual exploitation and crimes committed by UN peacekeepers,
Noting with regret the unjust budget for peacekeeping operations,
Recognizing the importance of the protection of human rights and that peacekeepers cannot violate them.

- 1. Recommends the enforcement of a fairly equal ratio of female and male peacekeepers and bridging the wage gap;
- 2. Declares that any peacekeeper who commits rape or violence against civilians should be tried and sentenced to imprisonment
 - i. Accused must be tried at the International Criminal Court with a jury from the home country and country where crime was committed
 - ii. Accused should be removed from UN peacekeeping forces;
- 3. Further recommends that in order to qualify to be potential peacekeepers, candidates must undergo thorough background checks and psychological evaluation;
- 4. Strongly encourages further use of multidimensional missions;
- 5. Further recommends the implementation of rehabilitation programs for accused peacekeepers;
- 6. Endorses further education for peacekeepers on the rules and regulations of their career;
- 7. Calls upon countries capable of doing so, to donate peacekeepers and funds;
- 8. Calls for an awareness campaign for refugees to cooperate with peacekeepers;
- 9. Requests NGOs to donate funds to help increase the efficiency of peacekeeping operations.
