

## **Draft Resolution GA/4/1.1**

### **Special Political and Decolonization Committee**

**Co-sponsors:** Japan, China, Angola, France, Russia, UK, USA, Venezuela, DPRK, KSA, Senegal, Egypt, Germany, Brazil, Uruguay, India, Serbia, South Africa, Netherlands, Kenya, Myanmar, Vietnam, Spain, Azerbaijan, South Sudan, Nicaragua, UAE, Antigua and Barbuda, Sweden, Namibia, Argentina, Uganda, Mexico, Malawi

Alarmed by the drastic effects of land mines and cluster munitions on civilians all over the world,

Deeply disturbed by the destruction of economies by anti-personal mines, especially the destruction of arable land,

Noting with regret the casualties caused by mines and affirming the positive effect of education about mines on civilians,

Aware of the fact that smaller countries cannot provide the same amount of funding that larger or more economically stable countries can,

Recognizing that some countries such as Afghanistan, Myanmar, Cambodia, Egypt, Nicaragua, Vietnam, Iraq, South Sudan, Namibia, Chile, Syria, Iran and Venezuela need more assistance than others for the removal of mines,

1. Affirms that education is a key to provide safer and better lives for civilians
  - i. Calls upon countries to place an emphasis on mine education and promote safety around explosives
  - ii. Education must include precautions to take in mine infested land and post detonation actions;
2. Encourages the creation of medical aid programs for civilians disabled by detonation of land mines in less developed areas
  - i. Provide medical training to the civilians of a mine contaminated area which would give enough time to transport an injured person to a medical facility, considering that many mine contaminated areas are rural
  - ii. Provision of medical supplies and first aid kits to civilians in mine contaminated areas to ensure that in case of an emergency supplies are readily available for civilians to use;
3. Approves countries to stockpile additional landmines to a limit of 25% of their current stock;
4. Encourages the use of trained dogs as a means to uncover and remove landmines;

5. Calls for the implementation of mine-free zones especially around borders in regions dominated by refugee camps;
6. Authorizes member states to map the location of planted mines to make their removal easier
  - i. The map must also be made available to civilians living around the mine infested region to ensure that civilians don't accidentally detonate the mine and cause casualties;
7. Calls for collaboration of NGOs such as Red Cross, Red Crescent, Halo, UN Voluntary Trust Fund, Mines Advisory Fund, Marshall Legacy Institute and ICBL to acquire resources for the removal of landmines and support of victims;
8. Requests all willing member states such as USA, China, France, UAE, UK, Netherlands, Argentina, Germany, Sweden and Japan to donate a minimum of 0.05% of their real GDP to implement the solutions, relative to the real GDP of the country;
9. Authorizes the use of Mine Kabon, an inexpensive and effective device for the detection and detonation of the mine without the loss of life and the use of the drone Mine Kafon for the detection of mines;
10. Urges all member states to comply with the resolution.
