Topic: Increasing Access to Renewable Energy

Full alarmed that countries are still using large amounts of fossil fuels to produce their energy, Deeply concerned that many nations support non-eco-friendly resources, Deeply disturbed by the inaction of certain governments on the matter of renewable energy, Alarmed by the prospect of a world without fossil fuels because nations have relied too much on them, Concerned by the fact that renewable energy represents a fairly low percentage of the total energy that humans produce worldwide, Fully aware that a large amount of people do not have access to renewable energy, Noting with deep concern that pollution generated by transport harms the atmosphere and results in negative effects towards humans by causing the greenhouse effect,

1. Requests that nation states support the development of R.E.L. (Renewable Energy Loans) which is an N.G.O. (non-government organization) that:
 - a. Provides zero-interest loans through the private sector to countries so that they can start using renewable energy,
 - b. Monitors the construction of renewable energy infrastructure,
 - c. Links remote settlements to the main power grid or creates on-site power sources;
2. Encourages countries to provide tax subsidies to companies and individuals that use renewable energy;
3. Encourages countries to increase their use of renewable energy by 5% by 2026;
4. Requests that the United Nations gives money to N.G.O.'s who will begin or continue to help developing countries build renewable energy sources;
5. Recommends that all countries finance research to:
 - a. Discover new renewable energy technologies, and
 - b. Make current renewable energy technologies better and more efficient;

6. Strongly encourages all countries to join the Sustainable Energy for All Initiative as it is an excellent platform for all parties to share success stories and technology so that all parties can learn about new technologies and be inspired to create their own projects;
7. Encourage companies and governments who run transportation systems to use renewable energy to power these transport vehicles;
8. Recommends an educational program that teaches the people the importance of renewable energy; and
9. Reminds the world that all new renewable energy sources need to be made and used in a sustainable way.
