Topic: "Right to self-determination"

The Third Committee,

Fully aware of the conflicts involving self-determination,

Realizing the importance of cultural background and differences,

Keeping in mind that all people have the right to self-determination, freedom, and division,

Alarmed by the severity of the situation in Palestine and deeply concerned by the outcome that is the result of conflict between Palestinians and Israelites,

Recognizing that many people are unaware or deprived of their rights and are in need of external help to realize their rights to self-determination,

Fully aware that concerning organizations in Chechnya need to be stopped, and that Chechnya has resorted to terrorism in an attempt to exercise their rights,

Emphasizing the importance of cultural background differences and unity while remembering the importance of rights to self-determination,

1. Calls upon the UN and the Unrepresented Nations and Peoples Organization (UNPO) to work together to help solve peacefully any conflicts arising from the right to self-determination;

2. Recommends that the UN and UNPO allow countries and territories a time to solve their problems internally: however, recommends that after that time has passed, the UN and UNPO send peacekeepers into the situation to assist with the peaceful resolution of the problem;
3. Supports the use of the UNPO and volunteers, whose purpose is to represent entities not recognized in the United Nations, and who also report Human Rights violations; and
4. Calls upon UNPO and the UN to be mediators and to negotiate a compromise between Russia and Chechnya, China and Tibet, and Israel and Palestine.
