Topic: Climate Change

The Commission on Sustainable Development, bearing in mind the impacts of climate change, recommends the following:

Understanding that climate change is disastrous, affecting not just the environment but all of humanity, and that it is at the root of many world conflicts,

Fully aware that humans are a cause of climate change and that we have the responsibility to act,

Noting with deep concern that humans only have a decade left to act before climate change is irreversible and that in order to accomplish bringing a halt to climate change we must make radical changes and take a quantum leap in our approach, working through adaptation, innovation, education and cooperation to mitigate climate change successfully,

Expecting that if we fail to act now, we will fail to leave our children to come with a peaceful and desirable world,

Recalling the first world conference on climate change in 1979 at Geneva, and urging world leaders to foresee and prevent human causes of climate change,

1. Invites all member states to use public service advertising to raise awareness and inform the human population about the harmfulness of climate change and ways to prevent it;

- 2. Recommends the promoting of renewable energy sources, investment in green energy, and the reduction of oil consumption and the production of greenhouse gasses;
- 3. Calls upon all nations to make binding commitments towards halting climate change such as expanding on resolution 67/200 on International Day of Forests to raise awareness on deforestation;
- 4. Further invites all countries to fully support Green Climate Funds to help underdeveloped countries get renewable energy and to innovate;
- 5. Strenuously supports the principles of sustainable development, seizing the opportunity, improving energy efficiency, promoting the reform of mining energy, and reducing air pollutions to combat climate change;
- 6. Suggests an international cap and trade system;
- 7. Encourages all nations to promote and improve public transportation in order to reduce air pollution;
- 8. Urges nations to innovate with battery technology that is environmentally safe, reliable and of great capacity, to make it possible to store renewable energy more effectively and reliably;
- 9. Invites all countries to come together and work as a single unit to help solve the global issue of climate change.
