

Resolution GA 3/1.1
General Assembly Third Committee (SOCHUM)
Topic: Social Development

The General Assembly, guided by the Convention on the Rights of Persons With Disabilities and Optional Protocol,

Concerned with the fact that 15% of the world population has a disability,

Fully aware that the discrimination of disabled persons with disability is a growing issue,

Noting with regret that proper health care is not affordable for most persons with disabilities,

Taking into account that it is important for persons with disabilities to be properly educated,

Welcoming new solutions to eliminate this issue and,

Deeply disturbed by the harsh treatment of persons with disabilities,

1. Encourages the community to educate the public about the awareness of disabilities as well as to promote symbiosis;
2. Considers creating one universal sign language and Braille;
3. Recommends that public places and transportation be more accessible to persons with disabilities;
4. Designates the education of sign language and Braille in schools;
5. Encourages the discount of medication relating to persons with disabilities;
6. Proclaims that we prepare reports on disabilities and rehabilitation based on the best scientific evidence;
7. Considers that foundations be set and funds should be raised to help persons with disabilities;
8. Calls upon society to be more inclusive towards people with disabilities;

9. Requests that the UN makes services and goods accessible for persons with disabilities;
10. Emphasises that community hospitals make regular inspections of women in pre-pregnancy to achieve early prevention of disabilities in newborn children;
11. Supports the promotion of equal access to health services and related facilities;
12. Encourages that disabled veterans of all ages should be entitled to equal health care;
13. Encourages schools to establish programs allowing abled persons to interact with persons with disabilities;
14. Requests 1.5 % of government organizations' employees should be hired from those registered as disabled;
15. Emphasizes that PWDs are entitled to the same rights as abled persons regardless of gender;
16. Believes that PWDs should have equal priority to abled persons in medical facilities;
17. Trusts that countries will collaborate with the UN in order to create a society where persons with disabilities are treated respectfully and equally.
