Topic: "Nuclear Security"

Co-Sponsors: The Security Council

The Security Council, aware of the possible outcome of a nuclear war,

<u>Deeply concerned</u> that countries still possess nuclear weapons,

Desiring to live in a world that is free of nuclear weapons,

<u>Fully aware</u> that current nuclear power plants are one of the most destructive powers,

Recognizing that the international community is concerned about the detrimental effects that nuclear warfare can cause on mankind,

1. Calls upon any United Nations member state that affirms this resolution to discontinue importation of all goods and exportation of all food items to and from any state that does not comply with the terms stated in this resolution, until the non-compliant party or parties agree to the terms of this resolution;

- 2. Requires all states, members of the United Nations or otherwise, to, with all due haste, begin reducing their nuclear weapons stockpile to twenty warheads per 500,000 citizens;
- 3. Requests all countries to pay a fee of 10,,000,000 USD every year for every nuclear warhead operated by the country to the United Nations. This money will be distributed to pay for the observation team's salaries, as well as humanitarian causes;

- 4. Declares that for every new nuclear weapon created, a country must pay a fee that is equal to 8% of the total cost of creating the weapon and this money would then go to the observational teams;
- 5. Understands the difficulty of maintaining a nuclear power plant and, to encourage the use of nuclear energy and to make it a more viable source, will dispatch every five months an observation team, consist of an ambassadorial procession along with authorized engineers and nuclear scientists. This team will inspect all known nuclear power plants to ensure compliance with mandatory safety regulations. These observational teams will each be assigned a specific power plant, which they will visit once every three months to inspect its safety regulations and maintenance protocols;
- 6. Emphasizes the necessary security of nuclear power plants in every country and will grant, if an official United Nations observation team decides any nuclear power plant is unsafe or unstable, an allotted period of time to the operator of the power plant to complete necessary adjustments, which will be articulated by the United Nations observation team; and
- 7. Accepts that this resolution will become active immediately after ratification by the Security Council. UN certified specialists will safely dismantle all discarded nuclear weapons, simultaneously, collected by the observational team. The remaining pieces of the nuclear weapons will be recycled or carefully disposed of, and its uranium core will be reused to power the power plants if possible.
