Topic: Child Labor

SOCHUM, reaffirming the Education Convention NO.138 of the ILO, which states that 'the minimum age for admission to employment shall not be less than the age of completion of compulsory schooling'

Aware of this international problem, Keeping in mind that all actions of child labor is illegal in most countries,

Deeply regretting that child labor is used even though it is illegal,

Bearing in mind that child labor is caused mainly by poverty, trafficking, and lack of education

- 1. Condemns companies that use child labor by sending patrols to shut them down;
- 2. Designates border guards at every country so that people can not take children hostage for unpaid manual labor;
- 3. Further requests campaigns to raise awareness about child labor;
- 4. Authorizes laws against the worst forms of child labor;
- 5. Calls upon police patrols to search buildings for child laborers;

- 6. Trust the governments to increase the amount of jobs for adults, so that children do not have to do manual labor;
- 7. Recommends a fair trade movement worldwide to stop child labor;
- 8. Further requests developed countries to donate funds for schools in developing countries;
- 9. Encourages countries to build orphanages for child workers to stay overnight;
- 10. Further recommends that factories holding children must provide education
