Topic: Fighting Organized Crime

The General Assembly Third Committee Social and Humanitarian, acknowledging that organized crime negatively affects many lives in countries all over the world,

Fully aware that a lack of education can lead to increased criminal activities,

Alarmed by the fact that organized crime is progressing quickly over transnational borders;

- 1) Encourages rehabilitation and safe-homes for families involved in organized crime;
- 2) Recommends educational programs to introduce the consequences and effects of organized crime to youth;
- 3) Further requests specialized police training to combat organized crime;
- 4) Encourages increased border control and safety to decrease and eliminate transnational crime;
- 5) Calls upon the United Nations to designate a subcommittee specifically for air and sea trafficking patrol;
- 6) Condemns tax havens to prevent free money being used for organized crime; and
- 7) Encourages NGO fundraising for anti-organized crime educational programs.
