Topic: Promotion and Protection of the Rights of Children

The Third Committee: Social, Humanitarian and Culture, reminding all nations of the [CRC] Convention of the Rights of the Child,

Bearing in mind that children need to grow in a clean and safe environment,

Taking into account that child labor is a growing issue that must be addressed,

Confident that organizations like UNICEF are working together to save children,

Recognizing that access to health care and safe drinking water is limited in developing countries,

Alarmed by the fact that today millions of children suffer in various ways,
Deeply concerned that millions of children don't have access to medical care and suffer
from poverty;

1. Requests member states to encourage schools to teach the importance of having a healthy lifestyle;
2. Requests periodical inspections against child labour in businesses;
3. Considers updating the convention on the rights of the child by adding more specific goals;
4. Recommends that organizations use the media to encourage others to support children in need;
5. Invites developed countries to accept children from developing countries that need to be relocated.
6. Strongly recommends the building of infrastructure to further enable accessibility of education programs and schools;
7. Requests funds to pay teachers for better education commitment.
8. Supports school programs to provide free meals and school supplies;
9. Requests schools to allow children to practice their culture or religion freely as well as allowing them to speak their mind;
