Topic: "Situation in Syria"

The United Nations Security Council, aware of the severe political, economic, humanitarian crisis in Syria,

Bearing in mind UNSC resolution S/RES/2165 authorizing cross-border access to the United Nations to deliver humanitarian supplies,

Condemning the actions of the Assad regime and the violations against human rights,

Conscious of the thousands of refugees, internally and externally displaced by the mass violence,

Emphasizing the thousands of casualties of innocent people inside Syria caused by this conflict,

Noting with satisfaction the peaceful actions that have been deployed,

Deeply disturbed that the situation is worsening and the number of Syrians needing urgent care has reached 10.8 million,

Reaffirming Security Council resolution 2043 of 21 April 2012, which condemns violence in all its forms by all parties and urges to protect civilians and stabilize Syria,

- 1. Further requests that all countries help build a peacekeeping force only meant to protect civilians;
- 2. Affirms that this peacekeeping force should remain politically neutral;
- 3. Calls upon neighboring countries to open their borders to refugees;
- 4. Calls upon the International Community to help build refugee camps in the country of Syria;
- 5. Considers creating an arms embargo, fortifying Syria's borders and ending interference from foreign fighters;
- 6. Calls for a cease fire for at least a month;
- 7. Further requests both sides in Syria to release their hostages;
- 8. Calls upon the Security Council to continue observing the situation in Syria.
