Topic: "Situation in Israel-Palestine"

Devastated by the loss of over 220,000 lives during this conflict,

Unsatisfied by the lack of peace talks hosted in recent years,

Satisfied by the work of numerous Non-Governmental organizations that have contributed to the cause,

Deeply concerned by the 4.98 million Palestinian refugees living in dire conditions,

Alarmed by the numerous missiles that have been launched by both sides,

Deeply disturbed by the hostility expressed by the leaders of both sides,

Viewing with appreciation that as of 2008, there have been 225 resolutions concerning Israel and Palestine,

Noting that the Peel Commission proposed the splitting up of Israel and Palestine into separate countries

Having heard that as of January 2014, the U.S. arranged Israeli-Palestinian negotiations have not had any tangible results,

Noting with approval that as of 2013, Israel has been condemned in 45 resolutions by the UN Human Rights Council,

- 1. Draws the attention to the fact that most Israeli and Palestinian citizens want a two state solution;
- 2. Calls upon Israelis and Palestinians to sign a treaty for a permanent cease-fire;
- 3. Notes that Palestine hopes to become a member state in the United Nations;
- 4. Strongly recommends negotiating obvious borders between Israel and Palestine;
- 5. Further requests to de-militarize borders between Israel and Palestine;
- 6. Encourages the Arab League and further invites the world to provide funds for Palestinian refugees;
- 7. Emphasizes practical steps forward on the ground that move Palestinians toward construction of a state by:
 - a. Building effective institutions such as:
 - i. Government ministries,
 - ii. courts, and
 - iii. police,
 - b. Improving the economy so that it is less dependent on foreign aid;
- 8. Encourages fewer checkpoints and fewer obstacles to mobility;
- 9. Informing World Bank IMF (International Monetary Fund) to help to solve this issue by providing funds which will be made by forming charities;

- 10. Suggests all the nations pave the way for peace process and create a peaceful atmosphere;
- 11. Urges member nations to help if a nuclear threat is near or imminent;
- 12. Recommends that a peacekeeping treaty be presented to the countries in the Middle East;
- 13. Calls for ceasefire of both sides;
- 14. Recommends that all children are educated about this issue and what they can do to help solve it;
- 15. Draws attention to creating a Montessori Peace School.
