Topic: Situation in Israel-Palestine

The Security Council, reminding all nations of the celebration of the 50th anniversary of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, which recognizes the inherent dignity, equality, and inalienable rights of all global citizens,

Devastated by the over 220,000 lives lost during this conflict,

<u>Unsatisfied by</u> the lack of peace talks hosted in recent years,

Concerned by the lack of respect that Israel and Palestine have towards each other,

<u>Satisfied by</u> the work of numerous Non-Governmental organizations that have contributed to the cause,

Deeply concerned by the 4.98 million Palestinian refugees living in dire conditions,

<u>Upset by</u> the numerous missiles that have been launched by both sides,

Sickened by the hostility expressed by the leaders of both sides,

- 1. Draws the attention to the fact that most Israeli and Palestinian citizens want a two state solution;
- 2. Calls upon Israel and Palestine to sign a treaty for a permanent cease-fire;
- 3. Reminds both sides that if either breaks the treaty, sanctions will be imposed and/or Peacekeeping Missions will be put in the area;
- 4. Considers having portions of East Jerusalem as Palestine's capital city and West Jerusalem as Israel's capital city;
- 5. Expresses its hope of having Palestine as a Member State in the United Nations after it becomes a country;
- 6. Strongly recommends negotiating obvious borders between Israel and Palestine;
- 7. Further requests to de-militarize borders between Israel and Palestine;
- 8. Encourages the Arab League to provide funds for Palestinian refugees;
- 9. Trusts the P5 (particularly the US) to provide funds for Israel in compensation for Israel allowing Palestine to become its own country;
- 10. Further proclaims that the world should provide funds to Israeli people who wish to move back to Israel from Palestine;
- 11. Further invites the world to donate funds to Palestinian refugees; and
- 12. Condemns the West Bank barrier and wishes for it to be knocked down in order to have peace.
