Alarmed by the growing demands and protests for a good energy source,

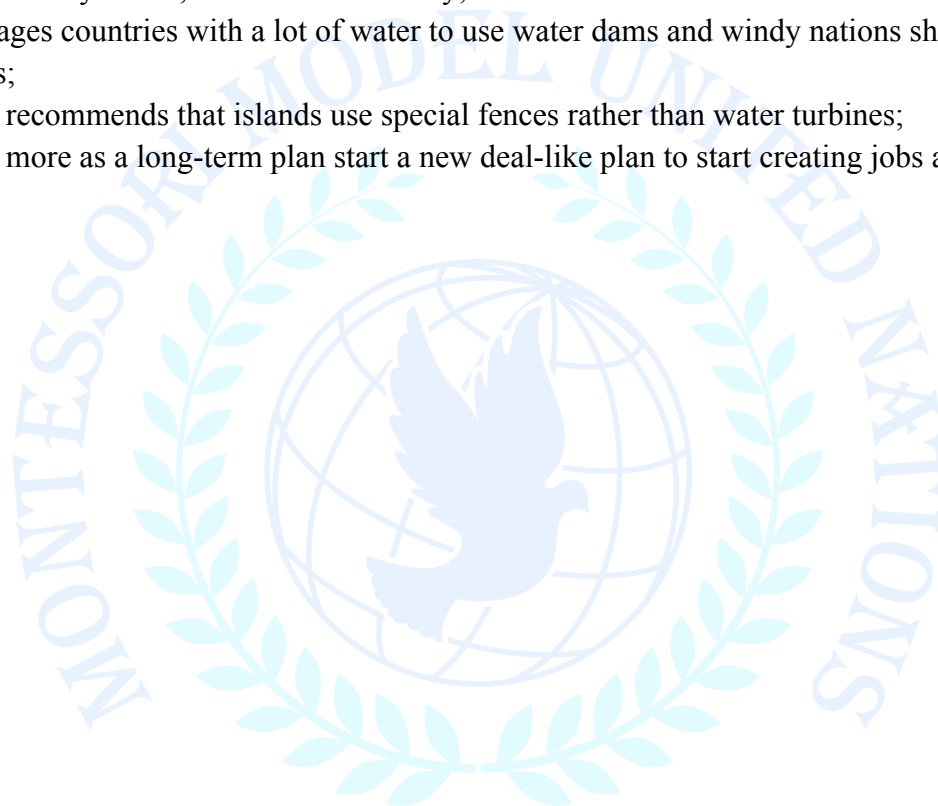
Keeping in mind that the more used energy sources, like oil, are no reliable,

1. Recommends that most developed countries donate money to create wind and solar energy to countries that lack energy;
2. Acknowledges having sporting events to raise money for solar and winder energy;
3. Noting that the lack of energy in the world can be solved, by informing non-profit organizations such as the IEA, EECA;
4. Encourages all relevant agencies of the United Nations to collaborate more closely on the issue of affordable energy;
5. Requests that all nations stop fighting and stand together as one community to eradicate the lack of energy;
6. Calls upon states to respond fast and generously to solve this issue currently happening around the globe;

7. Keeping in mind that most nations use dirty energy, that causes breathing issues, and kills plants;
8. Fully aware of the fact that citizens across the world are suffering from energy poverty, which makes them live uncomfortably, starved, and with a lack of filtered water;
9. Reaffirming that poor countries can not afford environmentally friendly services so they buy dirty energy like biomass which pollutes the earth;
10. Requests all nations to install Geothermal power plants because it has an extremely low price, it is easy to use, and it is eco friendly;
11. Encourages countries with a lot of water to use water dams and windy nations should use turbines;
12. Further recommends that islands use special fences rather than water turbines;
13. Further more as a long-term plan start a new deal-like plan to start creating jobs and power plants.
