UN Women acknowledge that there are impediments to women's lack of economic empowerment in the workforce, which include religion, society, violence, poverty, young pregnancies, child marriage, lack of education, and lack of job opportunities.

1. Understanding that women have been deprived of the right of economic empowerment;
2. Encourages women to participate and take positions in government to influence people to take action for women's economic empowerment;
3. Provides women employment guidance and professional training;
4. Allows women to take governmental role in developing countries;
5. Promotes women in the workplace to achieve gender equality;
6. Insures that security is given so that women are safe and secure in the workplace;

7. Requests that all developing nations in the UN require children of both genders attend school until the age of sixteen; and
8. Urges all reluctant members to create organizations to build trauma centers for women who have been abused and encourages countries to provide safe environments for women who have been hurt by the cause previously stated, knowing that women will feel more included to take jobs.
