The UN Women, taking into consideration that women are just as important as men in the world and have the right to life, liberty, and deserve equal rights.

- Recommends education for all women and girls in order to learn about their rights; at the same time, educate men and boys to understand and respect equal rights for both genders by establishing an organization funded by willing corporations to fund schools throughout the world and hold seminars to educate children and adults;
- 2. Encourages more women to participate in government, using a set amount of women in government in order to influence other women to take action;
- 3. Requests companies to ensure paid maternity leave and allow women to retain their jobs after giving birth;

- 4. Establishes institutions to provide special training that provides women with useful information about the advancement in the workplace;
- 5. Spreads economic knowledge to women so they can receive good, well-paying jobs;
- 6. Expands social security for women so they are insured;
- 7. Cooperates with NGOs to deliver more effective advocacy campaigns for women;
- 8. Promotes equal opportunity in education through a standard curriculum (which applies only to public schools); and
- 9. Requests that all nations develop a gender quota system to ensure women have a place in government.
