Topic: Equal Representation of Women

Reaffirming the Resolution 64/289 of 2 July 2010, this created the UN Women by merging the Division for the Advancement of Women; the International Research and Training Institute for the Advancement of Women; the Office of the Special Adviser on Gender Issues Advancement of Women, and the United Nations Development Fund for Women,

Fully alarmed that the deadline for Millennium Goal Number 3 is close,

Reaffirming the Millennium Development Goal #3:

Promote gender equality and empower women. Eliminate gender disparity in primary and secondary education, preferably by 2005, and in all levels of education no later than 2015,

Realizing that domestic violence is a major obstacle that prevents women from participating in the society,

Taking into consideration that only 15.6% of parliamentary seats are held by women globally,

Bearing in mind that women hold only 25% of senior management positions worldwide,

Deeply concerned that while the majority of women work in the agricultural role sector the women of the world own only 1% of the land,

Noting with regret that only 5 to 15% of female attorneys are partners in law firms,

1. Recommends trading women in development countries in agriculture business and agro technology so that they will have increased opportunities and be able to start their own businesses;
2. Draws the attention to the promoting of the political education of women, so women can gain capacity building and skill development;
3. Urges to amend the laws to ensure women to have an equal position in the parliament and other organs of power;
4. Further requests member states to promote equal pay for equal time of work for men and women, ensure women's rights through campaigning and advertising;
5. Suggests member states to provide guiding lines to limit the age of marriage. Because as the MDG once recoined that if the girls get married at a very early age they can not get education;
6. Suggests that member states establish support groups that are made to help women that have suffered from domestic violence;
7. Calls upon an establishing of sustain mechanisms for women and children, such as childcare centres, domestic support systems etc.;
8. Encourage member states to start to use measures to lead and effort the other countries;
9. Suggests focusing on teaching girls in school about protecting their rights. Then when they grow up they can catch chances to show themselves as equal human beings;

10. Strongly encourages member states to establish mandatory checks in order to discover if a woman is being abused;
11. Further recommends member states to offer free psychological help for women suffering from abuse;
12. Recommends schools to offer basic self defence courses for girls, so they will know how react in case of sexual assault;
13. Draws the attention to that special, gifted woman to study or teach in organisations being leaded by the UN, to let them show their skills;
14. Recommend the use of the Quota system in all member states;
15. Encourage the use of youth political groups focusing on gender equality;
16. Reminding that in resolution 1325 (2000), the security council called on member states to increase representation in all institutions including the military (as observers), civilian police and humanitarian and human rights personnel;
17. Encourages member states to achieve 50% of parliament members being women globally by 2045;
