Topic: "Achieving Universal Primary Education around the world"

Emphasizing the second Millennium Goal of achieving Universal Primary Education,

Worrying about the number of school-aged children not going to school,

Desiring fundamental school supplies through charity and funding,

Creating an online website for volunteers and donations of school supplies and money which will be given to countries for the use of building schools,

Recommending a worldwide charity for the purpose of funding the website, paying the teachers and the creation of schools,

Observing the fact that many parents need their children at home to work and support the family, the work week can be shortened by two days, making it three days long,

Hoping that by 2055 we will have a 75% literacy rate in the world,

1. Accepts all donations of materials to build schools;
2. Believes there should not be any segregation in schools;
3. Endorses the creation of mobile schools in rural areas;

4. Confirms the importance of an area in which students can get an appropriate amount of exercise;
5. Suggests that the first year of primary education should be free;
6. Recommends the idea of children that go to school helping children that can't go to school through fundraisers, or by helping to volunteer at other schools;
7. Emphasizes the importance of reading, writing and math above special classes such as art and music;
8. Calls for a survey of the number of students that could be in each classroom so the appropriate amount of supplies can be bought;
9. Further requests to create a website in which people and countries can make donations that benefit education;
10. Suggests different nations collaborate to create a world-wide charity that works to help education;
11. Approves of the aid of experts going to find safe routes to a school and to purchase the proper vehicles;
12. Calls upon a coalition of lawyers to advocate children's rights.
