Topic: The Situation in Cyprus

The Committee,

Aware of the complex situation in Cyprus,

Seeking a reduction of tension between the two parties,

Bearing in mind the interest of both sides,

Emphasizing the human rights of the Cypriot people,

Observing the desire to ease the situation in Cyprus by both parties,

Fully aware of the oil exploration rights already purchased in Cyprus,

1. Recommends an agreement between both parties of the conflict, the agreement would be on the topic of peace and if either side disrespects the agreement then they should define a new boundary
 - a. Recommends 15% tariffs to be imposed if either side breaks the agreement;
2. Resolves to establish a demining force to remove mines and other unexploded munitions from the island of Cyprus;

3. Recommends the encouragement of tourists to travel to Cyprus in order to improve the economy and internal relations;
4. Supports a UNESCO sponsored education program for Cyprus.
 - a. Encourage the freedom to choose religion in Cyprus.
 - b. Encourage schools to not support a specific religion;
5. Calls for a huge reduction of the military forces on the island;
6. Further requests countries to pressure other countries to respect the oil exploration rights already bought from the Republic of Cyprus;
7. Authorizes pressure on countries through sanctions to respect Resolution 186 (Cyprus).
