Topic: Improving the Coordination of Efforts Against Trafficking in Persons

Recognizing climate change and helping areas that have been hit hard by climate change and natural disasters,

Observing that assorted food and protein options are often sent around the world to reach communities in need, releasing huge amounts of CO₂,

Recognizing that IDPs (Internal Displaced People) and refugees are at high risk of being trafficked,

Deeply concerned about the abuse of transporting people from different countries to other parts of the world to become slaves without knowing where they are going they are held hostages,

Deeply concerned on the matter that people can take control of people that are indebt or who have lost their jobs, making other people feel less powerful and silencing them,

Alarmed by the lack of security in certain countries, and concerned by how certain countries let traffickers get away with human trafficking,

- I. Further invites people who are at higher risk of trafficking to have safe spaces that have resources and the support of a hotline;

2. Designates a course and support system for immigrants coming into countries to help them get jobs and defend themselves, and help them receive quality education by giving them funds;
3. Recommends that at refugee camps, there be sanitation stations and safe shelters, especially for disabled persons, women and children. Encourages having clean and accessible pumps for water;
4. Requests that governments give farmers the resources to help establish community farms and support localized food growth. This would aid CO2 cutdown and support communities, without the continual need to restock these supplies;
5. Requests higher funding to groups that are trying to prevent deforestation and climate change;
6. Requests the government to assist incoming immigrants with acquiring all citizenship rights;
7. Encourages the reduction of littering around the world by separating and recycling waste;
8. Expresses its hope that if there is a government that is led by women there would be less gender inequality;
9. Encourages countries to use their money in schools to teach children about human trafficking as well as how to identify it and how to defend themselves;
10. Desires that people will mentalize children about certain issues that are bad for their community so they will try to end them;
11. Encourages countries to build more public schools in places where there are no schools so that children will have an education near them and adding hidden security cameras around schools, outside school buses and streets;

12. Further recommends free classes to inform people about human trafficking and free self defense classes to lower human trafficking rates.
