**Topic: Elimination of racism, racial discrimination, xenophobia and related intolerance**

Alarmed by how some countries allow people to commit crimes against people of different ethnicities with barely any charge,

Deeply disturbed by the percentage of injustice and police brutality in many countries,

Bearing in mind that many Asians are discriminated because of where they are from and their religion,

Alarmed by the amount of racial stereotyping in some countries,

Deeply concerned that people of colour often do not have access to quality education, equal pay, and voting rights,

Deeply conscious that poverty disproportionately affects minorities often because of unequal pay,

Alarmed by the bias in media coverage on racial injustice and discrimination,

Noting with deep concern that many security forces have negative biases that threaten the safety of communities,

1. Emphasizes the importance for countries to have more human rights laws;
2. Suggests that a fine should be charged to those practising racist beliefs;
3. Encourages people to create a document to share how large of a problem world hate speech is;
4. Further proposes that the press should use their platform to protect and support the United Nations' initiatives;
5. Emphasizes that countries should have more help for people who are prone to abuse;
6. Further recommends countries to allow tribes to live in peace where they have settled;
7. Encourages the formation of a committee to find out where racial stereotyping originates from;
8. Notes that if countries make treaties with indigenous tribes in their countries there will be less tension and discrimination between countries and them, and further reminds countries to stay loyal with other human rights treaties made in the past;
9. Calls upon countries to take down borders between races and people with different religions;
10. Requests that governments allocate funds to education and other resources about voting in impoverished areas which would work towards granting equal voting rights in these areas;
11. Calls upon governments to allow anybody to vote, when they come of age, no matter what their race, culture, or ethnicity is, and further recommends that governments create more anti-discrimination and anti-racism laws;
12. Recommends giving money to people that have low incomes or are in poverty;

13. Further recommends starting media trends to stop racism, similar to Black Lives Matter, Stop Asian Hate and the Kick It Out Generation;
14. Further recommends that governments encourage the creation of more unbiased journalism about racism and discrimination;
15. Further recommends that all social media companies attempt to ban all racist and/or xenophobic comments and posts;
16. Strongly recommends that governments observe and review their security systems to help educate and protect against these negative biases.
