Current NYC Status as of 23 July 2021

As of June 15, Governor Andrew Cuomo has removed most coronavirus restrictions in New York State. The government no longer requires businesses to maintain social distancing or masking and cleaning protocols; businesses are free to continue implementing these measures on an individual basis if they choose. In addition, businesses no longer need to gather patrons' contact-tracing information.

Restrictions remain in effect for large-scale indoor event venues (more than 5,000 attendees). Proof of vaccination can be used to eliminate social distancing and mask requirements. Unvaccinated or unknown vaccination status individuals who are over the age of four must continue to present proof of a recent negative diagnostic Covid-19 test result and wear masks within the venue. But social distancing can be reduced or eliminated between tested attendees, allowing venues to reach 100 percent capacity in all sections. For more information, visit ny.gov.

Health and safety protocols, like masking and social distancing, will remain in place in certain settings, including public transit and schools.

The State will continue to follow CDC guidelines for unvaccinated individuals, meaning that those who haven't yet received their vaccines should continue to wear masks indoors and maintain social distance.

In New York City, the subway has returned to 24-hour service. Riders must continue to wear masks. For more information, visit mta.info.

Proof of full vaccination status can be provided by attendees through paper form, digital application or the State's Excelsior Pass. For more information, visit ny.gov.

Additionally, Mayor Bill de Blasio signed an Executive Order eliminating the 5.875% hotel room occupancy tax rate for a three-month period, from June 1 through August 31, 2021 (other City and State taxes still apply).

NYC Travel Restrictions

Quarantine periods for domestic and international travelers entering the state are no longer required (though it remains recommended for those not fully vaccinated). Travelers from out of state—except for those coming from New York's contiguous states, which are New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Connecticut, Massachusetts and Vermont—must fill out a traveler health form, as do travelers coming from another country.

We are closely monitoring reopening plans for Broadway. We will share guidelines as soon as they become available.

Verified Participant Environment An Auto-Certification form (download form) by schools and teacher coordinators to be presented at Onsite Check-in regarding all onsite participants, which requires: (i) valid, complete, and proper documentation demonstrating that the participant received all doses of a recognized COVID-19 vaccination no less than two (2) weeks prior to the date of the onsite conference, or (ii) valid, complete, and proper documentation demonstrating that the participant received a negative COVID-19 test result no more than 72 hours prior to the beginning of the YFBW event, or (iii) proof of recovery from COVID-19 illness with a positive antibody test administered no more than 2 months prior to the date of the onsite conference. Teacher coordinators shall be responsible for gathering, collecting, compiling, and verifying (and producing at the Onsite Check-in, if requested by YFBW) all documentation required under this section, for all Onsite Participants associated or connected with the Registrant(s).
