Topic: Global Action on Patient Safety

Seeking safe environments as well as updating, affordable and accessible medical resources,

Noting with regret the number of patients and healthcare workers negatively affected by low quality healthcare,

Emphasizing the need for reliable medical records,

Sanitization Healthcare and Patient Safety

1. Recommends hiring qualified medical professionals to oversee the expansion of healthcare systems and hospital procedures such as sanitation and surgeries;
2. Urges countries to provide proper medical education using various methods such as mentorship programs and specialized classes;

Medical Accessibility and Training

3. Endorses cooperation between countries to provide medical resources and proper funding for healthcare systems;
4. Encourages that nations delegate equitable medical attention to all especially those in rural areas;
5. Suggests that member states provide universal healthcare to citizens;

Rights and Communication

6. Calls upon the World Health Organization to create guidelines outlining patients' and healthcare workers' rights to be adopted by UN member states independently;

Protection and Surveillance

7. Requests that the World Health Organization establishes an advisory committee to monitor hospital activities;
8. Supports penalties depending on extremity of malpractice and violations of rights.
