Topic: Public health emergencies, preparedness, and response

Noting with regret the lack of basic supplies such as food, water, and medicine in developing countries,

Aware of the lack accessibility and limited measures taken to address the deficit of resources,

Alarmed by the rising occurrence of natural disasters caused by pollution and the impact on all countries,

Expecting medical preparedness to assist in diminishing outbreaks,

Distribution and Accessibility

1. Calls for vaccine research and the distribution of food, PPE, and other medical equipment in the event of an emergency;

Emergency and Preparedness

- 2. Encourages nations to allocate a larger portion of their GDP's to emergency infrastructure healthcare such as adopting or expanding their universal healthcare systems;
- 3. Suggests availability for at-home work situations for the occupations that allow it;

Global Efforts on Health Preparedness

4. Requests that the World Health Organization creates a global response plan which includes standardized quarantine guidelines and back up medical equipment;

Preparedness for Natural Emergencies

- 5. Urges countries to measure greenhouse gas emissions and reduce them by 25% by 2030;
- 6. Advises the use of available natural resources to create structure that will lessen the damages of natural disasters:
- 7. Instructs member states to implement water filtration systems in order to reduce pollution induced diseases.
