Helping Educate People on Renewable Energy Forms

- I. Further recommends that countries educate on the topics of saving energy and sustainable energy:
- 2. Advises countries to create outreach programs supplying those in poverty with sustainable energy;
- 3. Encourages research into new forms of renewable and sustainable energy;
- 4. Calls upon countries to increase funding for advertisements regarding climate change and the creation of green jobs;

Transition to Renewables

- 5. Calls upon nations to assist developing nations in their transitions to renewable energy;
- 6. Draws attention to the need for countries to provide affordable clean energy solutions;
- 7. Urges developed nations to share technology, resources and funding with developing nations with the eventual goal of achieving net zero carbon emissions;
- 8. Recommends countries to develop eco-friendly energy that adapts to their climate and terrain;
- 9. Recommends moving forward with eco-friendly resolutions in order to counteract climate change;

Ensuring Access to Renewable Energy in Rural Areas

- 10. Requests help from developed countries with building sustainable energy plants in rural and undeveloped areas;
- 11. Emphasizes the need for sustainable off-grid power sources in order to achieve full sustainability;

International Relations

- 13. Reaffirms the need for protection of all sustainable power plants;
