Topic: Green Jobs as an Effective Framework for Sustainable

Agriculture

Deeply disturbed by lack of green jobs,

Realizing that more food must be made in sustainable way to meet the needs of the population,

Affirming the fact that a worldwide shift to greener agricultural practices would create up to 200 million green jobs,

Realizing that while such a shift is necessary to stop the progress of the climate crisis this opportunity can be used to make economic growth by increasing crop yield and creating millions of jobs,

Keeping in mind that the use of too much fossil fuels is impacting our climate negatively,

Emphasizing that the use of harmful (unnatural) gasses is causing ocean salinity and rising CO2 levels,

Taking into account that green agriculture includes organic produce,

More Green Jobs for Sustainable Agriculture

1. Endorses access to training in green agriculture for all agricultural workers in order to efficiently increase crop yield and increase the number of green jobs in agriculture sector;
2. Strongly encourages the use of no-till (NT) farming specifically to regenerate topsoil in a practice proven to increase crop yield by 50%, reduce labor when planting crops and increase the pay grade of rural farmers due to unnecessary increased yield;
3. Emphasizes financial incentives be used to persuade agriculture companies and farmers to switch to green practices, growing the economy if successful;

4. Recommends that agricultural land be switched to use for organic practices in areas where pesticides and toxic fertilizers are common and more jobs must be created;
5. Urges that public awareness be raised on the availability and accessibility of green jobs and their diversity across economic sectors and career paths;

Ways to Achieve Sustainable Agriculture

6. Considers securing our food supply and transitioning towards sustainable farming;
7. Strongly requests being transparent on the pesticides used in our food and recommends the use of natural pesticides;
8. Calls upon countries to help developing nations shift to sustainable agriculture;
9. Further recommends governments to protect ecosystems and focus on aquaculture;
10. Encourages the promotion of green jobs towards youth;

Green Agriculture to Solve Other World Issues

11. Draws the attention to green jobs by recommending organic and non-GMO crops;
12. Requests ensuring food security and production while attempting to maintain sustainable agriculture practices;
13. Further recommends to increase awareness for green jobs to help sustain the Earth and the environment;
14. Further requests people to volunteer in fields considering green jobs;
15. Advises the harvesting of produce to provide for the less fortunate as well as helping to sustain the environment;
16. Further proclaims the increase of manufactured electric cars to reduce the use of fossil fuels and create green jobs in auto manufacturing;
17. Encourages struggling and developing countries to focus on creating green jobs to lower poverty and improve the economy;

Renewable Energy

18. Recommends incorporating more natural gas plants to better the health of the climate;
19. Further recommends planting more trees and building places to store excess carbon
20. Suggests the solution of implementing more solar, wind, and hydro powered alternatives for harmful energies;
21. Also urges and encourages other countries to use renewable energies in agriculture that will generate a shift in the world's energy;

22. Expresses its hope to better the climate with initiatives for a better, cleaner, carbon neutral world;
23. Calls upon the international community to make a climate efficient world a normality by reducing fossil fuel use;
24. Invites all member states to focus on maintaining the agriculture by using different energy sources.
