Topic: Green Jobs as an Effective Framework for Sustainable Agriculture

Recognizing the many countries that put in hard work and effort into the situations at hand and also noting that many things still need to be better addressed, such as CO² emissions throughout the world,

Bearing in mind that for green jobs to attract a workforce, jobs need to have decent pay and safe working conditions, so people can have a sustainable, reliable income while staying safe and healthy,

Deeply concerned about the amount of people who are not educated about green jobs and the benefits that come with them,

Realizing the positive impact of green jobs will have on the sustainable development goals by 2030,

Calls upon nations to incentivize sustainable agriculture,

Recommends the usage of crop rotation,

Alarmed by the excessive amount of CO₂ emissions from Earth-harming tasks, such as industrial works and oil drilling,

Recommends the usage of crop rotation,

Realizing that people are not interested in green jobs,

Recognizing that communities need to be connected,

Decent Work, Decent Pay, and Workers' Rights:

- I. Recommends creating better work environments;

2. Draws the attention towards workers who want to be acknowledged and heard in the workforce;
3. Calls for an increase of pay in all communities through green jobs;
4. Invites new opportunities for people to get green jobs;

Advertising, Raising Awareness, and Education:

1. Requests that schools adopt programs dedicated to agriculture, as well as after school program and field trips;
2. Calls for training programs for anyone who would like to work in the green job industry;
3. Encourages the UN to create social media platforms, news paper, online sessions, and events open to anyone who would like to teach, practice, and learn about agriculture;
4. Suggests that companies build billboards promoting green jobs and documentaries teaching people about them;
5. Supports sponsorships with green jobs and highly recommends advertising;
6. Advises platforms to create online experiences to attract the younger community to get involved in green jobs and sustainable agriculture;

Sustainable Agriculture and Technological Innovation:

1. Urges fellow delegates to support the green cap project;
2. Advises innovating efficiency of sustainable agriculture by using new technology and tools;
3. Emphasizing renewable energy sources such as solar, hydro, and wind power;
4. Strongly condemns the use of fossil fuels and other harmful energy sources as they are dangerous to the planet;
5. Recalls that green jobs help farms produce more crops.

Supporting the Community:

1. Seeking sustainable agriculture to be designed in such a way that communities need for food and resources is met without compromising the planet;
2. Requests that by signing this document all member states support green jobs and the movement for a sustainable framework for agriculture;
3. Also urges donations for better equipment;
4. Encourages more environmentally sound opportunities for farmers;
