Topic: Ensuring Access to Affordable, Reliable, Sustainable and Modern Energy for All

Deeply disturbed by ecosystems being corrupted by unsustainable energy,

Fully aware that not everyone can afford sustainable energy,

Fully aware of the past and present effects that unsustainable energy has on the environment,

Alarmed by the rate of increased greenhouse gas emissions while taking into account previous impacts and keeping in mind that not everyone is educated about greenhouse gasses and their effects,

Noting with regret that some countries that can afford to use renewable energy do not because non-renewable energy source are cheaper,

- 1. Expresses its appreciation for NGOs that help developing countries afford renewable energy;
- 2. Encourages all countries to use more solar power;
- 3. Requests that companies produce more sustainable energy sources and make it more accessible;
- 4. Condemns any personnel responsible for oil spills in oceans;

- 5. Calls upon businesses and countries to invest in research for renewable energy sources and highly encourages manufacturers to use more renewable energy sources;
- Recommends for wind farms to have bird safety features and to be built in locations where birds don't usually fly in;
- 7. Endorses the use of agrovoltaics;
- 8. Requests the use of hydroelectric dams as well as the research for added marine safety and encouragement of using hydropower;
- 9. Calls upon reduction of fossil fuels and carbon emissions;
- 10. Draws the attention for more biodegradable products;
- 11. Expresses its hope that there will be no more greenhouse gas emissions into the atmosphere by 2030;
- 12. Requests increased use of eco friendly electric vehicles and appliances;
- 13. Encourages countries to tax companies based on how much greenhouse gasses they emit;
- 14. Invites a global cooperation to tax countries that produce CO2 and use the money to get everyone sustainable energy;
- 15. Calls upon countries with low access to sustainable energy to work with NGOs that can provide it;
- 16. Emphasizes the need for countries to create renewable energy campaigns to raise awareness,
- 17. Recommends schools to train students to tackle electricity shortages and other problems,
- 18. Further requests developed countries with sustainable energy to help growing countries afford it;
- 19. Further recommends countries to hold seminars to educate people about greenhouse gasses and its effects;
- 20. Expresses its hope for all countries to install sustainable energy sources.
