3. Welcomes people to spread awareness through social media platforms and websites;
4. Supports green tourism;

### **Financial and Economic Resources**

5. Further requests collaboration between developed and developing countries to support biodiversity programs;
6. Recommends that sectors emphasize investments towards the development of sustainable technologies;

### **Sustainable Living**

7. Encourages financial aid from further developed nations towards people who are not able to afford sustainable biodiversity;
8. Calls for the creation of nature preserves worldwide to combat habitat destruction and protect ecosystems;
9. Encourages the use of sustainable technologies to monitor biodiversity statistics;
10. Emphasizes the need for sustainable agriculture and non-GMO products;
11. Suggests the widespread usage of renewable and sustainable energy sources such as; windmills, solar panels, watermills, and hydro-electric dams;
