Topic: Role of diamonds in fueling conflicts

Having examined the Kimberly process's inability to mark diamonds upon export and identify them upon import, the UNSC strongly recommends a series of solutions to solve the issue of misidentifying diamonds,

Noting with the regret the child labor affiliated with diamond mining,

Recognizing the number of unsafe working conditions in the diamond mines,

Deeply concerned by the environmental damages and societal consequences of blood diamond mining,

Acknowledging the Kimberly process has greatly reduced the output of blood diamonds in international markets,

Environmental solutions and impact

- 1. Calls upon younger generations to spread awareness through social media and word of mouth;
- 2. Suggests the creation of an independent board for each continental group;

3. Recommends a fundraiser which supports and strongly encourages people to help rebuild the environment;

Reconstruction of the Kimberly process

- 4. Decides to solve the issue of diamond marking, when a diamond is first mined it could be registered on a database so then, after the diamond is shipped to other Kimberly process members it could be scanned and identified and requests that if the smugglers are caught then economic sanctions should be applied on the non-law abiding party;
- 5. Requests stricter and more thorough investigations of non-Kimberly process diamonds;
- 6. Strongly encourages nations to fund the Kimberly process;

Safety

- 7. Welcomes funding to countries developing their mining forces;
- 8. Strongly condemns illicit mining programs for allowing child labor;
- 9. Emphasizes the severity of child labor and environmental harm within diamond mining;
- 10. Calls upon enforcement of mining regulations;
- 11. Demands working conditions in the mines are better regulated;
- 12. Encourages NGOs to send humanitarian aid to countries in need;

Securing the diamond trade

- 13. Demands the definition of "blood diamonds" be redefined;
- 14. Directs peacekeepers to develop countries struggling with administration of human rights;
- 15. Urges countries with high tension to be investigated for the use of blood diamonds in conflicts.
