- 2. Affirms aquaculture to help repopulate fish;
- 3. Further invites all member states to preserve habitats for all wildlife for a sustainable future for both wildlife and humans;
- 4. Affirms sustainable farming to counter deforestation;

Climate Destruction

- 5. Strongly encourages countries to pass new laws for pollution;
- 6. Encourages all to obey laws so it would not lead to further biodiversity loss;
- 7. Also urges to clean the ocean as well as improving hulls and propellers of container vessels;
- 8. Proclaims that we should prioritize mitigation of climate change;
- 9. Encourages all member states to enforce a carbon tax;
- 10. Recommends individuals to use fewer plastic materials and more reusable material;
- II. Supports approving more solar and wind power plants;

Industrial and human action

- Advises states to increase their use of green energies and to refuse the use of greenhouse gasses;
- 14. Further requests that we reduce the cost of clean energy and eco-friendly products;
- 15. Encourages bundling nature into urban areas resulting in cleaner cities and other communities;
- 16. Strongly encourages more countries to open more green spaces;
- Recommends more investigations into businesses found polluting our waterways and environment;
- 18. Encourages funds to community services to pick up litter;
- 19. Designates funding and investments for research on biodiversity loss.
