Topic: Impact of the Ukraine-Russia conflict on global food security and related matters

Taking into consideration that bombings are blocking ways to transport imports and exports,

Noting with regret that many countries have a lack of food and supplies,

Acknowledges that there are Ukrainian refugees,

Fully alarmed by the ending of imports and exports due to this issue,

Aware of the how bombing affects crops,

Having considered that many countries' supplies and resources are largely from Ukraine and Russia,

Supporting Financing Countries in Need

1. Approves education for farmers;
2. Considers donating supplies to people in need through NGOs and fundraisers;

3. Recommends providing supplies to hospitals and refugee camps;
4. Encourages fair trade;
5. Calls on all parties to respect humanitarian laws and protect citizens and infrastructures;
6. Endorses lower prices for essential goods;
7. Calls upon the creation of food parties;

Transportation of imports and exports

8. Encourages affordable shipping for food companies;
9. Advises countries to find more secure food companies for over-sea shipping;
10. Draws attention to dangerous shipping routes;
11. Recommends spreading awareness of dangerous transportation routes for imports and exports;
12. Suggests using different modes of transportation;

Effects on the world

13. Advises countries to keep supporting aid organizations for people who need food;
14. Requests donation of money, food and other essentials for Ukraine refugees;
15. Suggests purchasing seeds from other countries that produce grain and help grow crops;

Ending the war and world hunger

16. Considers loans to countries that are affected by the Russia-Ukraine war;
17. Encourages farmers to use things like plant pyramids, that produce more crops per square foot;
18. Emphasizes that providing resources to farmers means more crops will be produced;
19. Recommends eating less meat because it's two-thirds of farmland is livestock;
20. Recognizes that ending this war could help provide a fair proportion of food and other supplies to other countries.
