Topic: Empowerment of Rural Women

Fully aware of the fact that rural women have low chances of acquiring a house or having adequate housing,

Deeply concerned that only 15% of farmland is owned by women,

Observing that in rural areas healthcare is not sufficient,

Affirming that women do not have equal job opportunities and equal opportunities for loans,

Noting with deep concern that most rural areas lack access to education,

Underlining the importance of secure housing for rural women,

Noting with regret that unmarried women are still forced into marriage for land and are commonly abused,

Acknowledging the significance of safety from abuse,

Expressing concern for the lack of education in rural women,

Education and Well-being

1. Requests for governments to fund accessible school for rural women;
2. Invites hospitals to be built that are clean and accessible in rural areas;
3. Further requests more houses and farms to be built in rural areas,

Equal Rights

4. Acknowledges that there should be less land ownership restrictions for women;

Employment

5. Supports women entrepreneurs to reach out to bigger companies to be heard;
6. Urges companies and schools to have easier job applications for women, as this would allow for increased job opportunities;
7. Strongly encourages building programs that help rural women get access to jobs that would usually be for men, and example of this is ZUBO;

Security

8. Welcomes the idea of bringing women local and international together to share knowledge;
9. Further requests that women-led groups are established in villages to help support one another.
