### **Topic: Adequate Housing**

Alarmed by the effects of inflation, all composers have expressed that this is an urgent and pressing issue,

Recognizing the lack of homes, cost of homes, and destruction of homes worldwide, Noting the impact of refugees on the cost of homes,

Recognizing that overpopulation is directly affecting the number of available houses globally, Noting with regret how inadequate housing can affect health,

Recognizing the effect of living in slums or overcrowded environments,

Regrets to inform that people are losing their jobs and pay due to COVID-19,

#### Conflict

- 1. Accepts that we should create more natural disaster shelters;
- 2. Strongly encourages stable countries to decrease pollution;
- 3. Reminds member states of pollution and advises the community to clean the oceans;
- 4. Requests member states to designate an area with low cost housing;

#### Resources

5. Calls upon certain organizations to help create a successful living environment for low income citizens;

- 6. Further proclaims that volunteers for the UN could reinstate inadequate houses and transform them into schools or communities where uneducated children and adults can learn;
- 7. Calls upon member states to ensure that everyone has adequate housing;

#### **Health and Education**

- 8. Encourages member states to create service centers with volunteers to assist people in need (with clean water, sanitation, medical services, etc);
- 9. Reaffirms maintaining stress free and clean houses;
- 10. Advises citizens to do community service at least once a year if possible and highly encourages more than once;
- 11. Welcomes school programs for tiny house development;
- 12. Further recommends renewable energy resources to be installed such as solar panels;
- 13. Further welcomes focusing around half an hour each week on adequate housing to spread awareness in school.
