Topic: Rights of the Child

Acknowledging that kids are drinking, smoking, and using illegal substances,
Bearing in mind that children are living in inadequate conditions,
Recognizing that children have the rights to basic necessities but unfortunately not all of their rights are met,
Reaffirming that all these rights should be met,
Alarmed by the effects of sexual abuse,
Deeply concerned of the outcome from school shootings,
Alarmed by the lack of education in children today,
Noting with deep concern the lack of awareness for children's rights,

Health

1. Advises that healthcare prices should be lowered for children under 18;
2. Strongly advises that children under 18 be kept out of smoke shops;
3. Emphasizes the lack of attention to mental health problems in children;
4. Designates time in schools that teaches children about the effects of drugs;

Basic Necessities

5. Calls upon member states to fund or create community gardens to help provide food for children;

6. Encourages member states to create public water filtration systems so children have access to clean water;
7. Requests member states to create exchange and repairs centers for clothing;
8. Suggests that all member states create transportation to transport children and people in need;
9. Requests member states create temporary homes out of leftover materials for children and citizens in need;

Violence and Abuse

10. Calls upon the UN to implement NGO programs to train police to apprehend sexual predators and take them to mental health hospitals;
11. Further invites further schools to adopt high tech security x-ray cameras or metal detectors for all doors;
12. Affirms that the UN and government would fund all these solutions;
13. Advises countries to make harsher punishments for sexual predators;
14. Encourages countries to set aside money that would provide for these programs;

Education

15. Invites member states to participate in learning programs and develop kits;
16. Encourages member states to attend seminars educating them on children rights;
17. Emphasizes that member states should participate in creating a learning seminar for citizens;
18. Calls for building more schools for children in need if possible;
19. Urges neighboring member states to assist in educating other member states citizens who can't afford proper education for their citizens.
