Topic: Adequate Housing

Fully aware that natural disasters affect cities and people,

Deeply concerned by the lack of clean water and sanitation for people in poverty,

Aware of the fact that millions of people are suffering from homelessness because they do not have access to well paying jobs and services they need,

Shelter for Natural Disaster

- I. Endorses countries to construct natural disaster shelters and houses with sustainable and environmental materials (reusable plastic, glass and bamboo) with a space to store food and water ensuring it to be clean because there will be less waste in the landfill and/or ocean:
- 2. Encourages more stable shelter and requests useful supplies;
- 3. Recommends shelter for people who lost their homes due to natural disasters;
- 4. Supports lower cost for houses and sustainability;
- 5. Requests governmental support for food, water and shelter;

Services and Healthcare

6. Requests the government to create more opportunities sustainable services and jobs;

- 7. Endorses cities to construct buildings with sustainable materials to ensure water is not contaminated;
- 8. Calls upon the governments to make strong donations to NGOs;
- 9. Further invites the UN and governments to donate more money to housing and shelter programs to the people in need;

Housing for the Poor and Homeless

- Encourages countries to help the homeless find good jobs through the NGOs concerned;
- 11. Further invites countries to provide sustainable housing materials and technology security;
- 12. Recommends that countries further their attention to building and funding homeless shelters;
- 13. Considers expanding the use of subsidized housing worldwide;
- 14. Supports free basic education to homeless children around the world;

Security and Stable Housing

- 15. Encourages the more fortunate to donate;
- 16. Recommends a free inspection for mold for the less fortunate, and if there is any mold scientists can make a non-toxic spray to kill the mold.
